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## PHILOSOPHY

The Lufkin Middle School Band has a tradition of excellence in music, level of responsibility, and behavior inside and outside of the band class. We expect all members of the band to exhibit these qualities. Each individual must be committed to working toward the goals and betterment of the Lufkin Band program. When these expectations are met, being a member of the Lufkin Middle School Band will teach you many things including music, responsibility, dedication, and pride.

## BAND HALL EXPECTATIONS

1. No food, gum, candy, or drinks will be allowed in the band hall.
2. No horseplay or rough-housing; anything broken as a result of horseplay will be repaired at the expense of the student.
3. Instruments should be stored in their cases with the latches closed in their designated cubby when not in use.
4. Have a pencil and all other necessary rehearsal items at your seat BEFORE class begins.
5. No talking while a director is talking.
6. Treat other people and their property with respect.
7. If you must miss a performance or rehearsal, notify a director as far in advance as possible. Missed performances may require you to complete an alternate assignment.
8. Practice regularly! Make an effort to improve daily. Your growth directly impacts the success of the program.
9. Most importantly, give the directors your full attention and respect at all times.

Any band student who fails to adhere to the set rules, whose behavior does not meet our expectations, or who represents Lufkin ISD Band in a negative way, will not be allowed to continue in our band program. This will be decided at the discretion of Lufkin band directors and administration.

## SUPPLIES

In order for your students to be successful in band, we ask that you purchase a few necessary supplies for their instruments. All of these items can be purchased through our band office.

- Mouthpiece for brass instruments
- Reeds for woodwind instruments (plus, neckstraps for saxes)
o Clarinets - \$3
o Alto Saxophones - \$4
o Tenor Saxophones, Bass Clarinets $-\$ 5 /$ reed for $\mathrm{LaVoz}, \$ 6 /$ reed for Vandoren
- Oboe/Bassoon - according to who makes them and current market value
o Bari Saxophones - \$6/reed for LaVoz, \$9 for Vandoren
- Cleaning supplies for all instruments (Swabs, cork grease, slide grease, valve oil, etc)
- Lost music can be replaced for 25 \$ per page.

Prices are subject to change at any time.

## FINANCIAL OBLIGATION

Students are responsible for returning all school issued equipment. Any student who uses a school owned instrument must sign a contract provided by the band directors. Our facilities and equipment are to be treated with respect at all times. Fees will be charged to any student who damages any band property. Band directors will determine if repairs on school owned instruments will be charged to the student. Students with personally-owned instruments are responsible for upkeep and safety of their own instrument.

## GRADING PROCEDURE

Your grade will consist of two components- daily grades and major grades. Daily grades make up 40\% of your report card grade and major grades make up $60 \%$.

Daily grades will consist of:

- weekly participation grades made up of:
o respectful, considerate behavior
o having all materials including a pencil
o active participation
- added assignments
- Written Quizzes
- required performances (behavior, materials, uniform, and attendance will affect)

Major grades will consist of:

- chair tests
- music pass-offs
- required materials check
- Written Tests


## PASS-OFFS

Students will be given specific music selections that they have learned in class and will play for a director as a test grade. These pass-offs serve as a benchmark of our students' learning and help us keep track of their progress.

## CONCERT DRESS/UNIFORM

Concert uniforms for $7^{\text {th }}$ grade band will be black pants, black shoes, black socks, black belt, and LMS Band polo. The polo is available to purchase through the band office for $\$ 22$. This uniform is to be worn to LMS football games, Honor America Night, Pre-UIL Concert, and to UIL Concert and Sight-reading competition.

There will be no uniform for the spring concert. Students may wear nice, conservative clothes. Boys should wear nice slacks with a dress shirt or polo and dress shoes. Girls may wear pants, dresses or skirts. Dresses and skirts should be conservative in length. Dresses and tops should not be low cut, strapless, or spaghetti strap.

Any student wearing inappropriate attire will not be allowed to perform at these events which will affect their participation grade.

## ELIGIBILITY

$7^{\text {th }}$ graders are able to participate in several competitions throughout the year. These competitions are run and regulated by the University Interscholastic League (UIL). UIL requires all participants to be passing all classes in order to participate. The eligibility of students will be decided by report cards and progress reports. We are required to follow the "No Pass, No Play" guidelines and will notify students affected by the policy prior to the event. If it is a required event, students who are ineligible will be given an alternate assignment to substitute for the participation grade of the event.

## AFTER SCHOOL REHEARSALS

$7^{\text {th }}$ grade members will be expected to attend a few after school rehearsals. An exact schedule will be given later, but you can plan on these:

- A couple of rehearsals the week before Honor America Night
- Weekly after school sectionals during contest season in the spring
- All-Region and Solo and Ensemble contest rehearsals/lessons

Students will be made aware of these rehearsals ahead of time and are expected to have a ride that will get them to and from rehearsal in a timely manner. Please avoid scheduling doctor's appointments during these after school rehearsals. If you must miss a rehearsal, please notify a director ahead of time if possible. Not having a ride is not a valid excuse for missing rehearsals and performances and will affect your grade.

## CONCERT DRESS/UNIFORMS

Football Games, Pep Rallies, Honor America Night, and Christmas Parade uniforms will be as follows: LMS Band polo, blue jeans, black or brown solid color belt, white socks, and solid white tennis shoes.

Concert uniforms for $8^{\text {th }}$ grade band will be black pants, black shoes, black socks, black belt, and LMS Band polo. This will be worn to the Pre-UIL Concert, and UIL Concert and Sight Reading Contest.

There will be no uniform for the spring concert. Students may wear nice, conservative clothes. Boys should wear nice slacks with a dress shirt or polo and dress shoes. Girls may wear pants, dresses or skirts. Dresses and skirts should be conservative in length. Dresses and tops should not be low cut, strapless, or spaghetti strap.

Band members that are out of uniform will not be allowed to perform. This will affect their participation grade. Please make sure you have purchased all necessary items well before they are needed.

These activities are run and regulated by the University Interscholastic League (UIL). UIL requires all participants to be passing their classes in order to participate. The eligibility of students will be decided by report cards and progress reports. We are required to follow the "No Pass, No Play" guidelines and will notify students affected by the policy prior to the event. If it is a required event, students who are ineligible will be given an alternate assignment to substitute for the participation grade of the event.

## AFTER SCHOOL REHEARSALS

$8^{\text {th }}$ grade members will be expected to attend several after school rehearsals. An exact schedule will be given later, but you can plan on these:

- After school playing sectionals starting the 2nd week of school
- Marching practice after school starting the end of September
- A couple of rehearsals the week before Honor America Night
- Weekly after school sectionals during contest season in the spring
- All-region and solo and ensemble contest rehearsals
- Students will be made aware of these rehearsals ahead of time and are expected to have a ride that will get them to and from rehearsal in a timely manner.

## FOOTBALL GAMES

Attendance at football games is mandatory. As soon as we leave the band hall we are performing. Please act accordingly.

You are there to do a job - to cheer on the football team and add to the overall football game experience. Any students who misbehave will be asked to leave at the director's discretion. No food, drink, or gum will be allowed at any time during the game except for a bottle of water provided after half time. You will have assigned seats during the game, and must remain in your seat ready to play at all times. You will get the third quarter of the game off.

This is a privilege that can be taken away at any point by the directors.
We will leave when our job is done. The director will decide when that time is. No one is to leave before the band is dismissed except in special circumstances.

## COMMUNICATION

Communication is key to any organization, especially one as large as the LMS Band. ## CONCERT ETIQUETTE

Concerts are a time for our band students to perform and demonstrate all that they have worked so hard on. They deserve the attention and respect of everyone in the audience. Here are some helpful tips on how to be respectful during concerts:

1. Do not talk during the performance.
2. Do not get up and move around while the band is playing.
3. Make sure you turn off all electronic devices.
4. Consider taking crying children out in the hall.
5. Wait until the conductor puts their hands down to begin clapping.
6. No flash photography while the band is playing.

## SOCIAL EVENTS

We try to have several social events throughout the year. These are meant to be a fun time for students and teachers to get to know each other better. Past events have included a winter carnival, video game tournament, movie day, and roller skating party. At these events, students are expected to be kind, courteous, and respectful to all directors, parent helpers, and other students. Any student who misbehaves will be asked to leave, may be banned from all other social events, and in the worst circumstances will be removed from the band program.
