## LUFKIN ISD PRIMARY GRADING GUIDELINES KINDERGARTEN

Academic progress for students enrolled in **LISD's Kindergarten Program** will be based on district and state defined goals and skills. Each nine-week period the students will receive a report card showing their progress in meeting set goals and skills. Grades for the report card will be acquired through:

- Classroom checklists
- District benchmark checklists
  - ✓ Mathematics
  - ✓ Reading Readiness (which includes high frequency words, letter identification and letter sounds)
  - ✓ Writing
- Teacher observation

For Spanish Instruction classrooms, students will receive a report card showing their progress in meeting set goals and skills. Grades for the report card will be acquired through:

- Classroom checklists
- District benchmark checklists
  - ✓ Mathematics
  - ✓ Spanish Reading Readiness (which includes words, letter identification and letter sounds)
  - **✓** Writing
- Teacher observation

## **Academic grades** for kindergarten will be recorded as:

- E = Excellent (above grading period expectations)
- S = Satisfactory (on-level of for grading period expectations)
- N = Need Improvement
- U = Unsatisfactory

Target reading levels are established for LISD Kindergarten students based on DRA & EDL Reading Level Correlation Chart:

- DRA Oral Reading Level (Levels reflect the expected "On-Level for Grading Period Expectations" or "Satisfactory" goal for each 9 weeks.)
  - ✓ District Goal: DRA Oral Reading Level 1-1st 9 weeks
  - ✓ District Goal: DRA Oral Reading Level 2-2<sup>nd</sup> 9 weeks
  - ✓ District Goal: DRA Oral Reading Level 3-3<sup>rd</sup> 9 weeks
  - ✓ District Goal: DRA Oral Reading Level 4-4<sup>th</sup> 9 weeks
- Language Arts
  - ✓ Separate grades will be given for Listening, Speaking, and Writing
  - ✓ Mastery of uppercase letters, lowercase letters, sounds
  - ✓ Spelling VC and CVC words by end of third 9 weeks and CCVC words by end of year
- Spanish EDL Oral Reading Level (Levels reflect the expected "On-Level for Grading Period Expectations" or "Satisfactory" goal for each 9 weeks.)
  - ✓ District Goal: EDL Oral Reading Level 1 1<sup>st</sup> 9 weeks
  - ✓ District Goal: EDL Oral Reading Level 2 2<sup>nd</sup> 9 weeks
  - ✓ District Goal: EDL Oral Reading Level 3 3<sup>rd</sup> 9 weeks
  - ✓ District Goal: EDL Oral Reading Level 4 4<sup>th</sup> 9 weeks
- Spanish Language Arts
  - ✓ Separate grades will be given for Listening, Speaking, and Writing.
  - ✓ Mastery of Spanish uppercase letters, lowercase letters, sounds

✓ Spelling words with common syllabic patterns for third 9 weeks and end of year

## Other skills assessed:

- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Studies
- Physical Education
- · Music
  - E = Excellent (90-100) indicates outstanding and exceptional achievement. Always
    follows class rules, never disruptive in class, always tries their best and has a positive
    attitude in class, always on task.
  - **S** = Satisfactory (80-89) indicates normal and average achievement; applies to vast majority of students. *Usually* follows class rules, *rarely* disruptive in class, *usually* tries their best and *usually* has a positive attitude in class, *usually* on task.
  - N = Needs improvement (70-79) indicates passing but needs improvement. Rarely follows class rules, is disruptive in class, rarely tries their best and rarely has a positive attitude in class, rarely on task.
  - U = Unsatisfactory (69 and below) indicates unacceptable and below average achievement. *Does not* follow class rules, *is* disruptive in class, *does not* try their best and *does not* have a positive attitude in class, *not* on task.

There will be no **Kindergarten Progress Report.** Kindergarten students will only receive report cards at the end of each nine-week grading period.

**Learning How to Learn/Conduct grades:** Separate grades will be given for each indicator under the conduct section to include: behaves appropriately and follows class rules, respects others, respects authority, works cooperatively with others, follows directions, is dependable and responsible, and is willing to try new activities.
